home. If they are unable to help, they redirect the request to other civil society groups or non-

profit organizations.

3. Suggested answers. Accept all valid responses. In April, a woman just out of surgery in Bengaluru wanted to return to her family in Tirupati, over 250 km away. A volunteer from Caremongers India arranged for an ambulance to transport her.

In another instance, a volunteer brought medicines for an HIV+ man who had run out of the drugs, using a photo of the doctor's prescription.

- 4. At Cohiba restaurant in Goa, the staff prepares vats of rice cooked with meat stock and scraps. The 'doggie biryani' is then picked up by volunteers and dropped off at the beach, where lifeguards distribute it among 150-odd stray dogs.
- 5. The dogs had started going hungry in the absence of scraps from the beachfront restaurants once the lockdown started. This affected their behaviour in a negative way as they would come charging at people out of hunger and dehydration.
- 6. People in Goa responded enthusiastically to the call for help to feed the dogs. Cohiba restaurant offered the use of their premises and help from their staff in preparing the biryani. Other residents stepped forward with ration, meat and money.
